Background to Lobby Corps


- Originally established in 1971
- A team of 12 15 League members from the National Capital Area
- Convene once a month when Congress is in session for briefings on League legislative priorities
- Receive assignments to lobby select members of Congress
- Build valuable relationships with members on Capitol Hill

- ERA Ratification








New Challenges

Rising to the Challenge

- Staying engaged with all members of Congress
 - Inform, persuade, listen, facilitate constructive negotiation
- Leveraging our reputation to get our foot in the door
- Learning-by-doing:
 - Tele-lobbying is a new challenge
 - But also a new opportunity to work more closely with state and local leagues
 - LWVUS Lobby Corps: experience on Capitol Hill; national strategy
 - State and Local Leagues: in depth local knowledge and relationships



How can you get involved?

- Lobby Corps is looking to increasingly partner with state and local leagues to advance our agenda
 - For example, LWV-WV and Lobby Corps pioneered our first experiment with using FaceTime to join our usual in-person lobbying in a Congressional Office two years ago; more recently LWV TN, LWV AL, and others have participated in Lobby Corps members' tele-lobbying on appropriations for election assistance.
- Lobby Corps lobbies on LWVUS's federal agenda at LWVUS direction not used for state issues
